3 Discussion Groups

In the original conference call five key topics were identified to guide the conference. We shall use these key topics also as foci for respective discussion groups that have the opportunity to meet two times during the conference to shape the corresponding issues and themes, and in order to collate material for our intended publications (for the Conference Schedule, see Table 1):

Group 1: Goals deals with the orientation and diversity of universities in a globalized world dominated by economic paradigms, including the relationship between science and society (Convener: Liah Greenfeld).

Group 2: Governance covers the interplay of institutional autonomy and political control of universities (Convener: Kijan Malte Espahangizi).

Group 3: Focus addresses the role of the unity of teaching and research, basic versus applied sciences, and general versus professional education (Convener: Michael Hagner).

Group 4: Organization thematizes the connection between the organizational codes and rules, structural (i.e. morphological) aspects of university organization, and the dynamics, diversity and propagation of research and knowledge (Convener: Marcel Herbst).

Group 5: Monitoring discusses the assessment and measurement of productivity in higher education, considering various academic traditions (Convener: Markus Christen).
